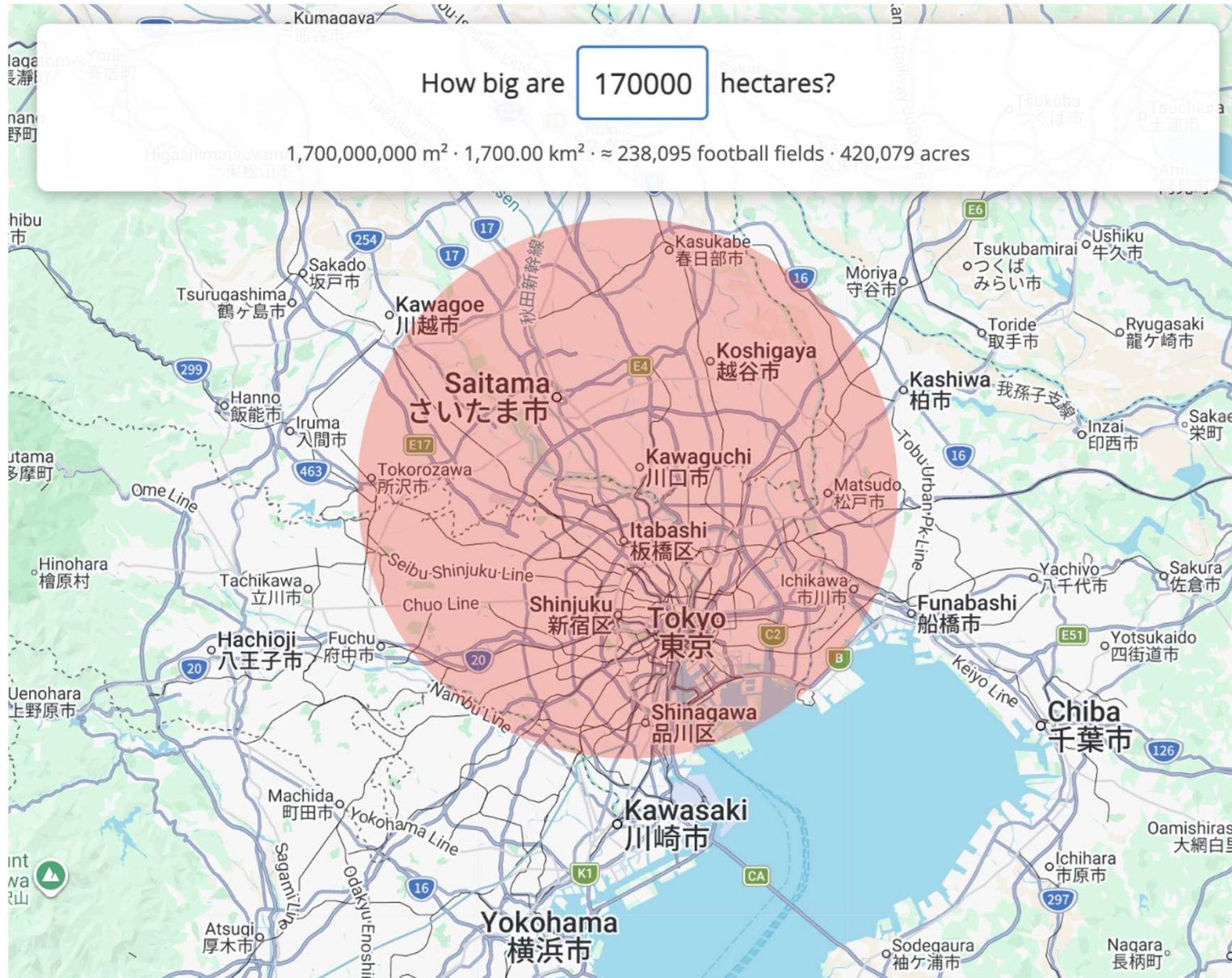

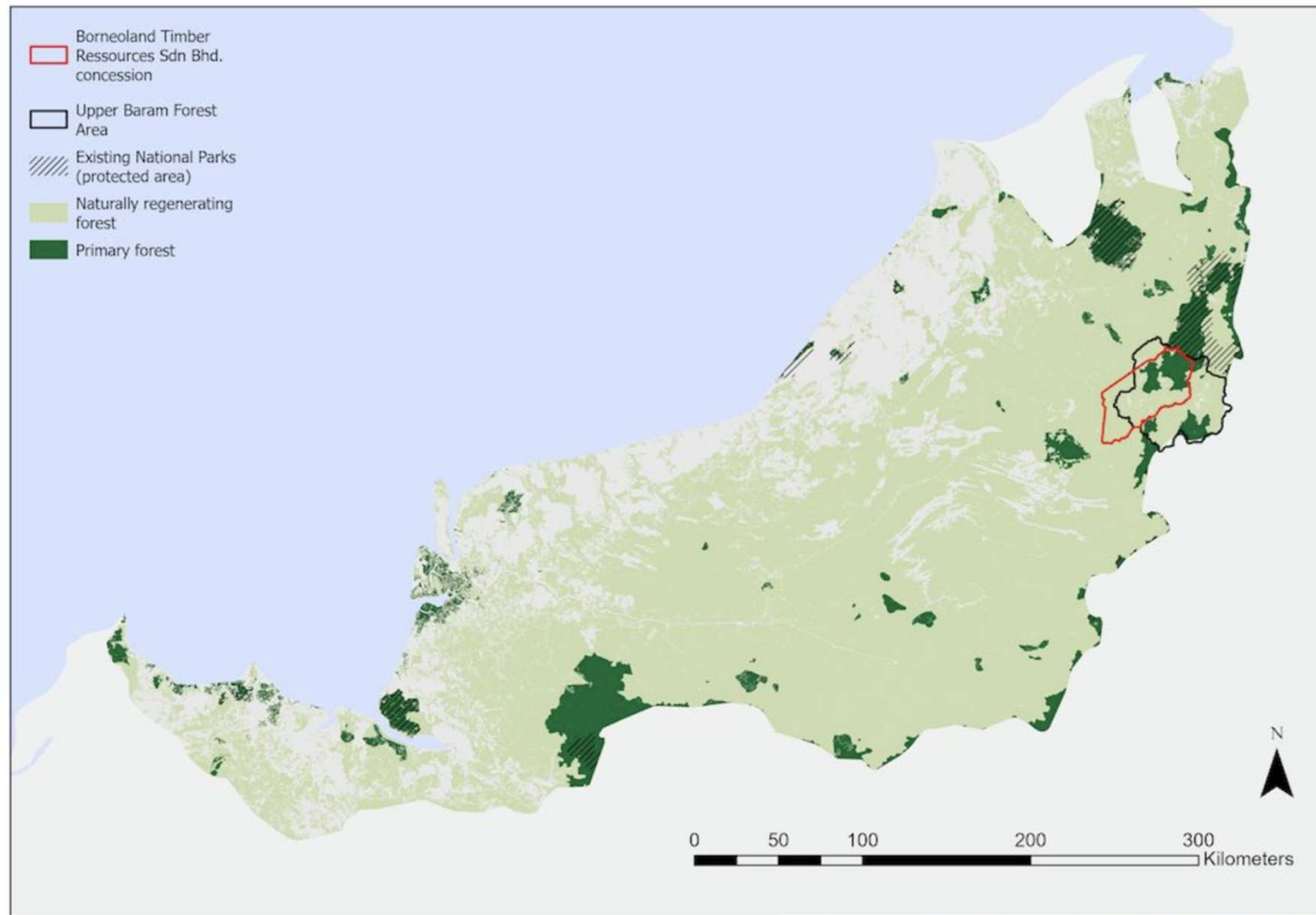

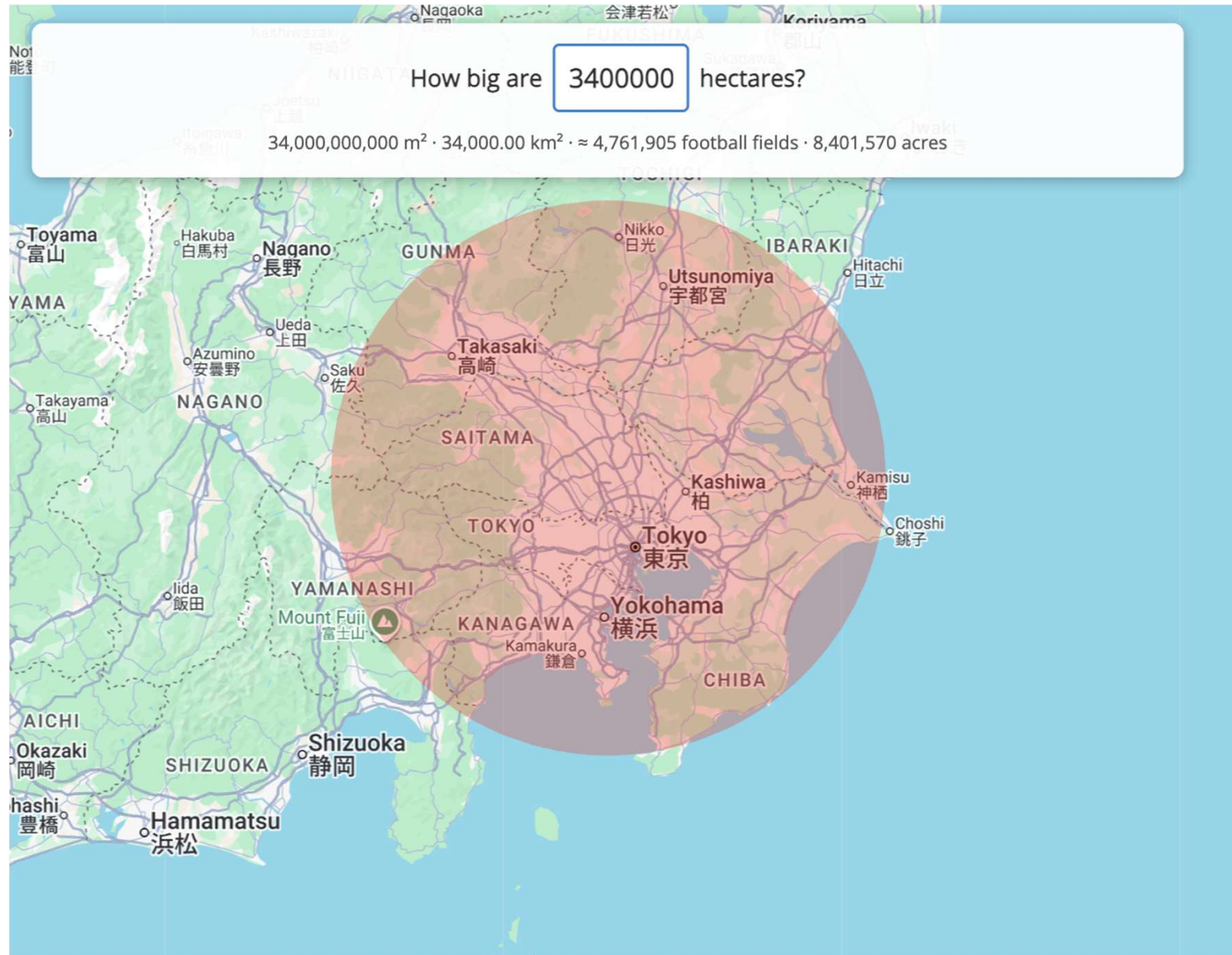

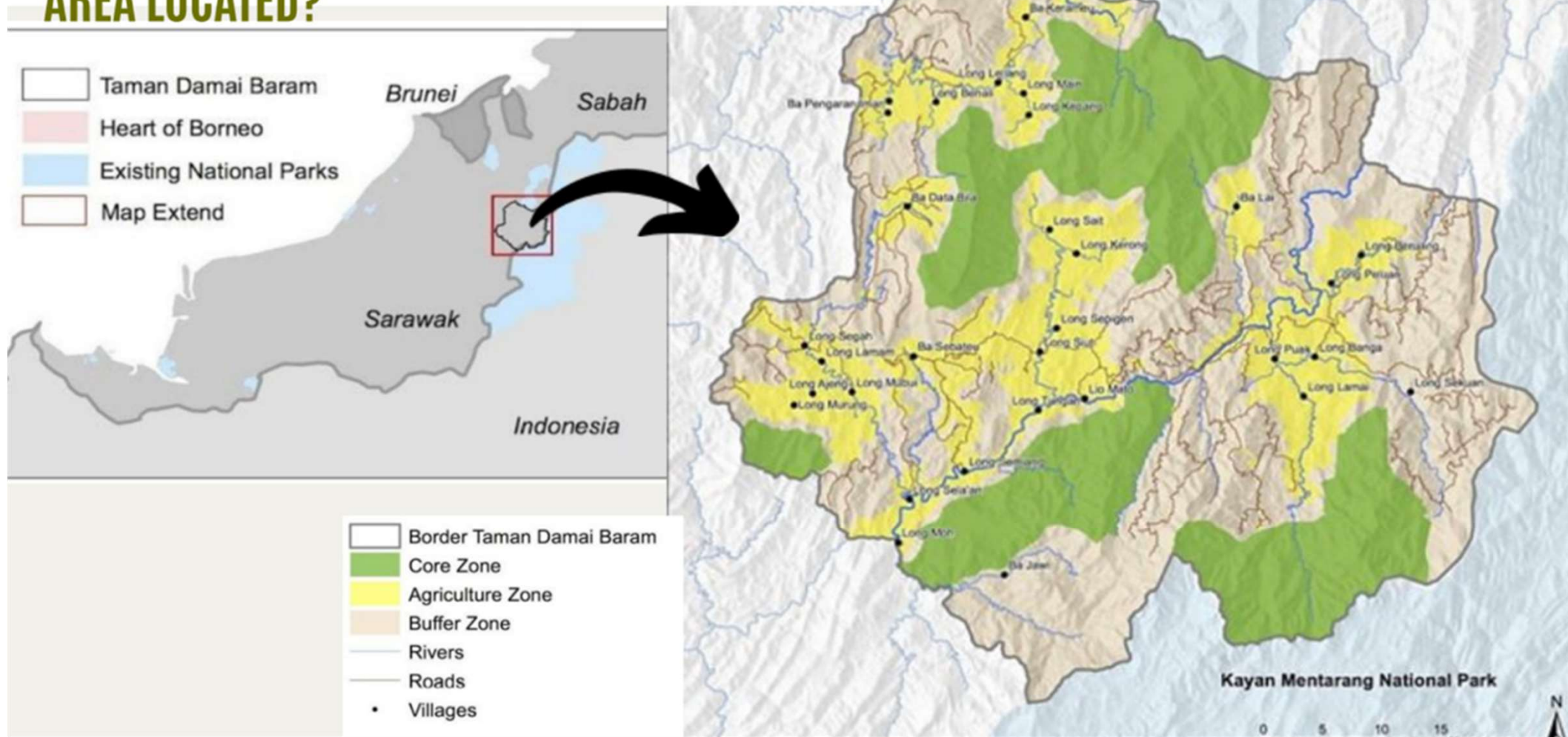
Sarawak's last primary forests (dark green), the area of the Baram Peace Park (black) and the Borneoland logging concession (red)

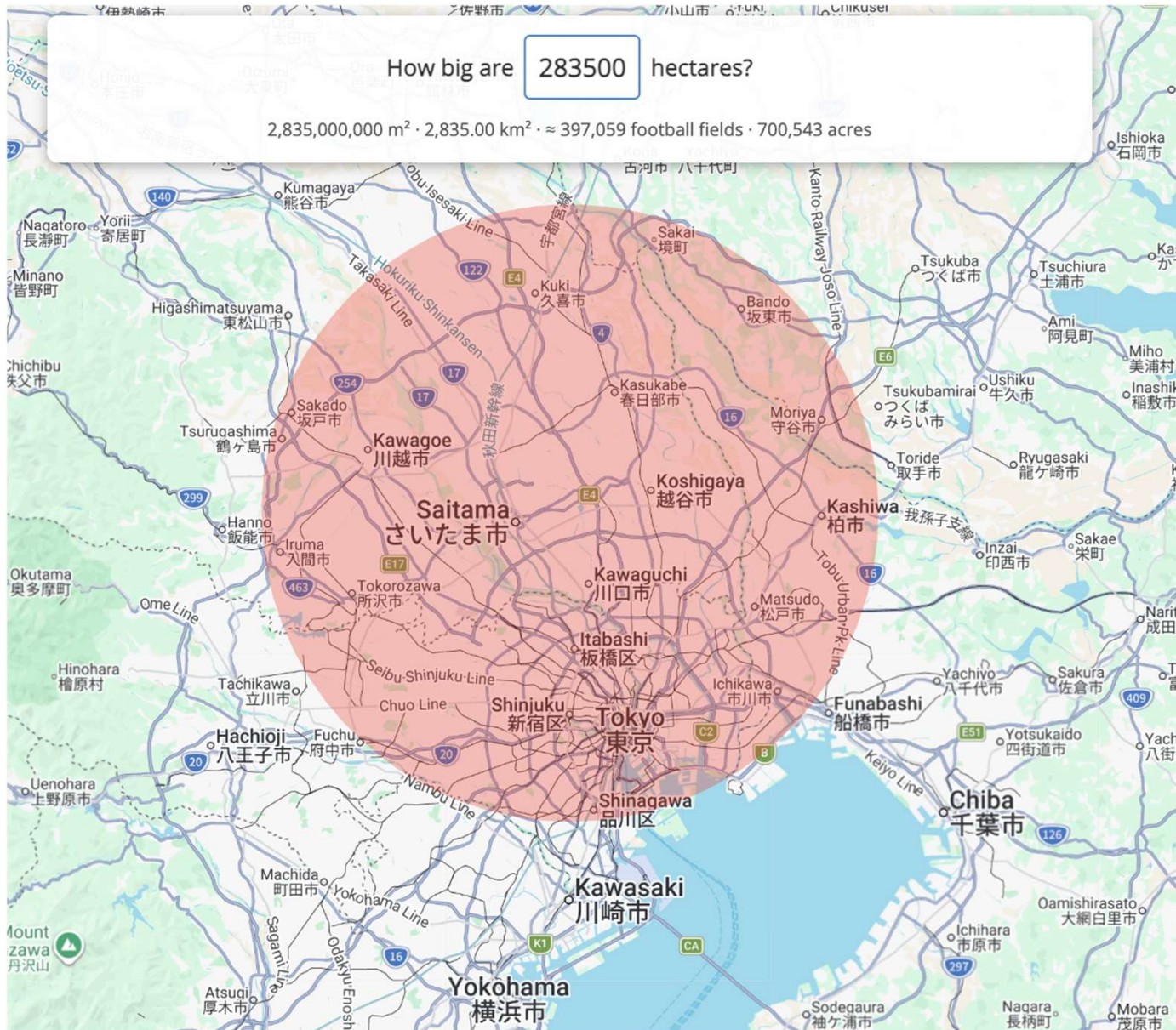


WHERE IS UPPER BARAM CONSERVATION AREA LOCATED?

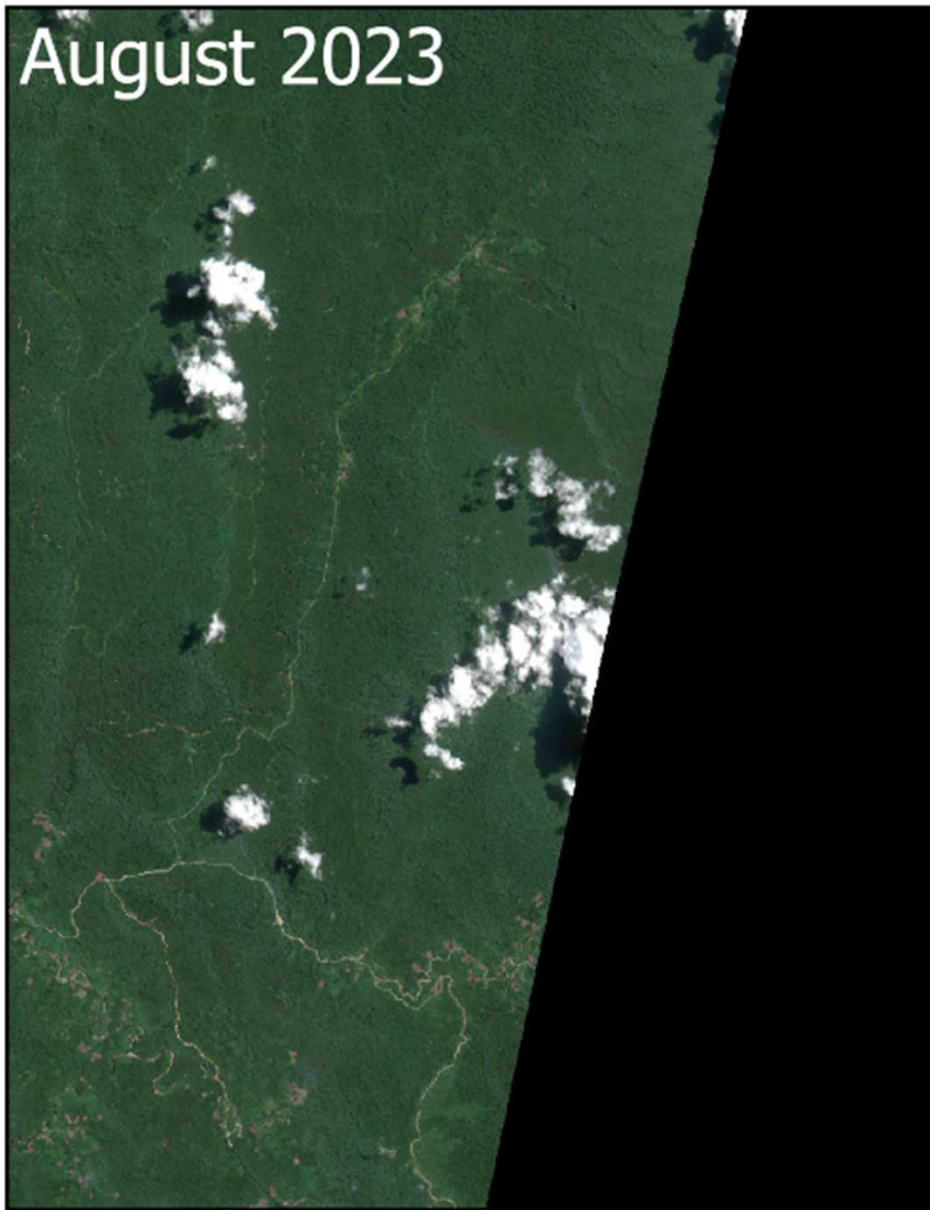

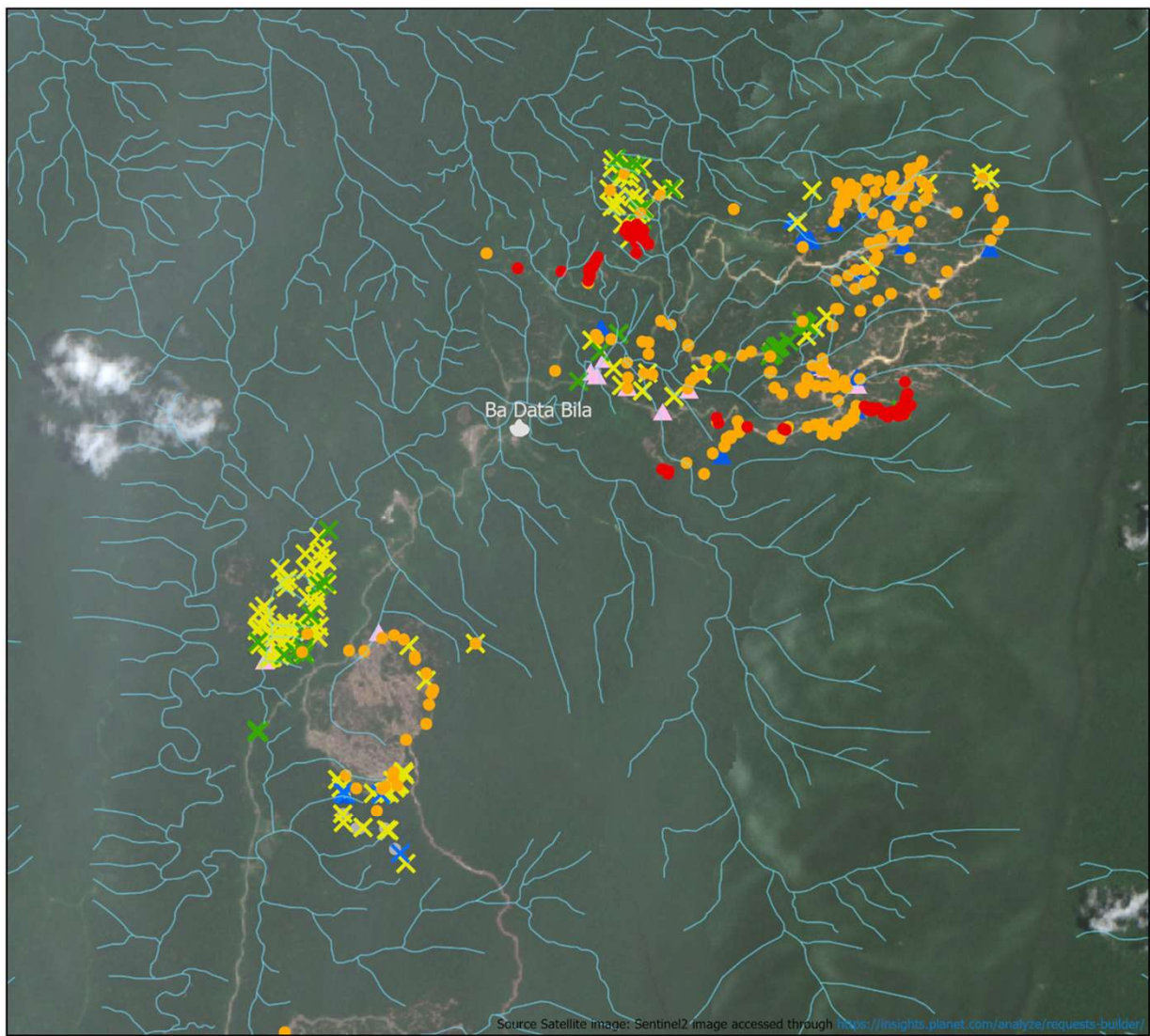

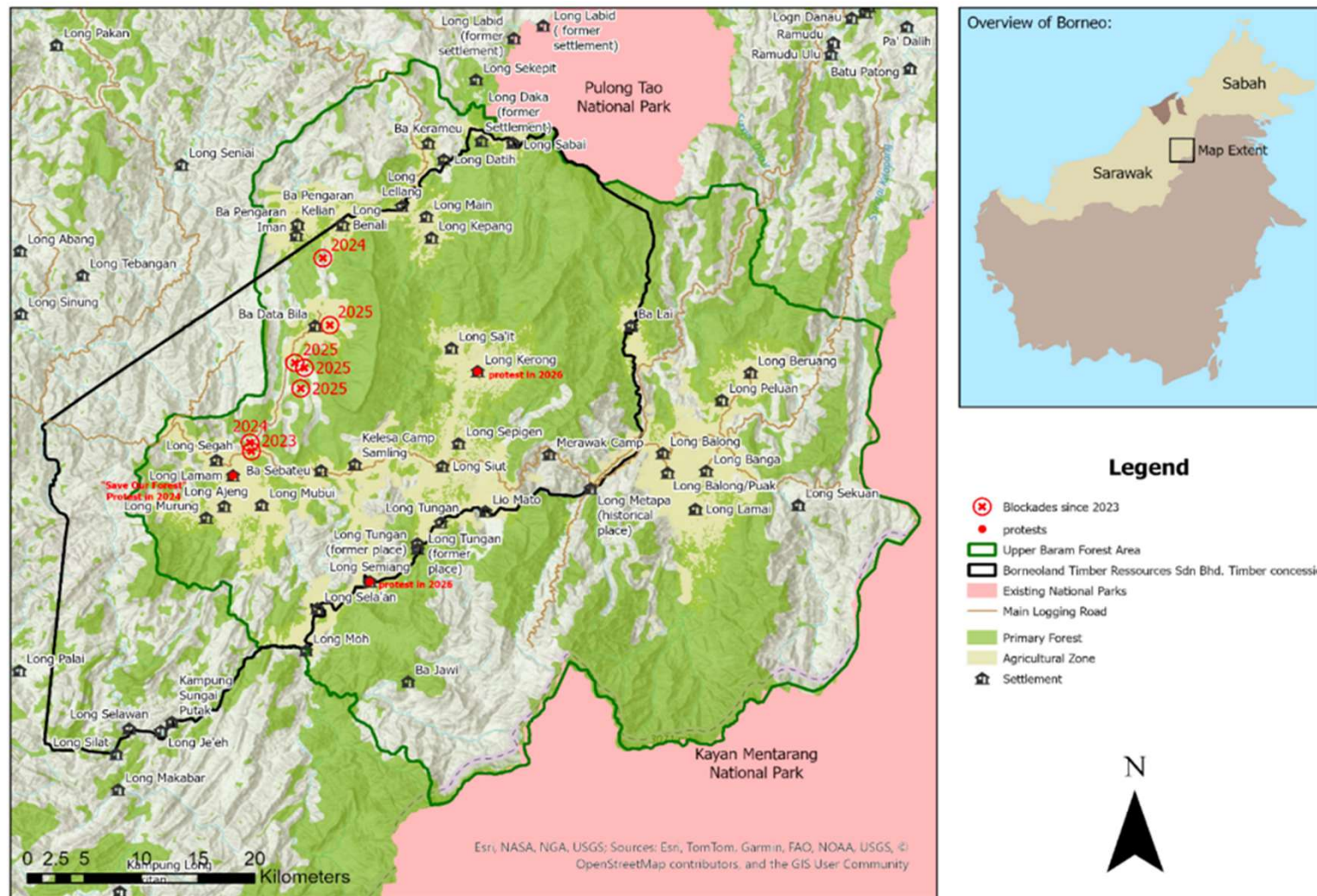

Contravention of Legal and Regulatory Frameworks

- 1. Failures of Governance** - Sarawak law affirms that communities may elect their own leaders (headmen), but these appointments are subject to government approval – creating incentives for candidates to align with state priorities over local needs.
- 2. Free, Prior, and Informed Consent (FPIC) and Indigenous rights** - The concession was issued without consultation, notification, or consent from the communities. No social or environmental impact assessments, were disclosed to affected communities.
- 3. Business and Human Rights Obligations** - Malaysia National Action Plan for Business and Human Rights (NAPBHR) must be uphold
- 4. Transparency, Access to information, and public participation** - Communities, project donors, and civil society organizations, were repeatedly denied access to information that would have allowed them to understand the scope of the concession, assess its impacts, or challenge its legality.
- 5. Environmental Commitments and Forest Governance** - Sarawak mandated all long-term logging activities to be certified under the Malaysian Timber Certification Scheme (MTCS) by 2025; yet of today, Borneoland is NOT certified.

Our demands to the Japanese government and Japanese timber trading companies:

- Prohibit the purchases of Sarawak timber amid the pending investigation
- Suspend ITTO funding in Sarawak until allegations are independently investigated
